As we approach the festive season it is always nice to look back and reflect on the progress that has been made throughout the term.

During this first term we have witnessed some exciting and positive achievements, both academic and vocational. These include six students achieving their level one equestrian award whilst horse riding at Weelsby Riding School. This involved students showing their understanding of saddlery, walking, trotting and changing direction independently.

We have also had a number of new appointments at Phoenix Park Academy this term. These new members of staff have settled in well and strengthened an already established team. We are more able to provide our students a mixture of academic and pastoral support using a variety of methods.

At the end of last half term Phoenix Park Academy had its first sea faring trip. For two days a fishing trawler was chartered and students were given the opportunity to experience life out on the open sea. During the trip a vast amount of fish were caught, too many to keep, and so some were let go as the baskets were full and there was no room left in the freezer. One student, Kevin Kraus, built a replica trawler out of balsa wood. This was extremely detailed and included fishing rods, baskets, nets and a wheel house with working wheel and rudder.





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After these trips, parents and governors were invited into school to observe the fantastic work accomplished by students over the course of the term and to feast on fish and chips, prepared using fish caught from the trawler and home-made chips. The feedback from the day was very positive and open days like these will be a regular feature at Phoenix Park Academy.



Mr Lucas and Mrs Matthews have worked extremely hard this term with four students designing and building go-karts. This project has proved to be very successful, with some students staying behind after school to finishing painting them. There is one go-kart that has a bumper, grill and even a number plate! The New Year will see the first Phoenix Park Academy race using said go-karts, stay tuned for the results.
